Bio: A graduate of the college course of the Normal School in the class of 1912, he received the A.M. degree in history from the University of Wisconsin in 1913 and the Ph.D. degree from Chicago University, with economics as his major in 1922. Between 1914 and 1931, he filled positions on the faculties of the Iowa State Teachers College, Evansville College, Lawrence College and DePauw University. Dr. Waldo F. Mitchell became the head of the department of social studies in 1931 and Indiana State Normal School.
