## Know the Skills that Employers are Looking for in Your Field

If you look at job advertisements you will find that employers are looking for specific skills. Here is a list of some of these skills in your major areas. Consider looking at more job ads in career center resources and on the internet. From job ads you will get an idea of job titles and needed skills to land the jobs you want when you graduate.

B.S. in Community Health, Safety Management, Environmental Health Sciences, or related degree with a preference for someone who has skills in multiple areas  
Internship/Co-op experience  
Knowledge of OSHA and EPA regulations  
Knowledge of safety laws, regulations, and procedures; workers compensation; safety equipment; ergonomics  
Knowledge processing wastewater, hazardous waste handling and disposal (HAZMAT certification)
